HE Annual General Meeting of the Association was held at 173, Great Portland Street (by kind permission of Miss Jeanie Smurthwaite), on Sunday, December 18th, at 2.45 p.m. The President, Madame Genée, was in the chair, and about fifty members were in attendance.

In the course of her opening address Madame Genée pointed out that during the year two examinations had been held in the "Elementary Syllabus," in which candidates for membership had to satisfy the Committee before they could be accepted. At these two examinations 161 candidates had offered themselves, of which number 107 had been accepted as members.

It was proposed to hold two further examinations this year in the Elementary Syllabus—one in May and one in September.

It was also proposed to hold an examination in an "Intermediate Syllabus" towards the end of June, open only to members—that is to say, to those who passed the Elementary Syllabus.

A final examination in an "Advanced Syllabus" will be held in 1923.

At the "Intermediate" Examination candidates will be divided into two groupsthose under thirty and those over.

The President, Committee and Secretary were re-elected for 1922.

It was pointed out that the existing Rules were merely tentative, and that a year's experience had shown that several alterations were desirable. The Committee would suggest these alterations and submit them to a Special General Meeting of the Association.

The Secretary submitted the accounts for

the year.

First, second, third, fourth, and fifth position.

Centre Practice.

Same as Side Practice with alternate feet and the use of both arms.

Adage.

Dégagés, chassés, coupés, posés, attitudes, arabesques, détournés, assemblés soutenus en tournant, fouettés, relevés, rotations, preparations for pirouettes, pirouettes sur le cou-le-pied, exercises on the demie pointe and ports de bras.

Steps.

Pas marchés, glissades (devant, derrière, dessous, dessus, en avant, en arrière), assemblés (as glissades), jetés, échappés, ballonés, temps levées, pas de basque, pas de chat, pas de cheval, fouetté movements and fouettés, pas de bourrée, emboités, déboités, temps de flèche, and elementary temps de pointes.

Changements, soubresauts and sissones.

Petite Batterie.

Simple royale and entrechat quatre.

Side Practice.

Ronds-de-jambe à terre commencing and ending with assemblé soutenu.

Ronds-de-jambe en l'air, commencing and end-ing with a demi-grand rond-de-jambe from a fondu position.

Special battements tendus, with bent knee and

extension for pointe work. Ballottés.

THE DANCING TIMES.

Pointe work à la barre. The use of various arms in barre work.

Centre Practice.

The five positions of arms with pliés. Jetés battements.

Adage.

Pirouettes en dehors sur le cou-de-pied, by Quarter, half, one and two turns from a demiplie in the fifth.

One turn from a full plié.

Two turns from ordinary preparation ending in attitude, arabesque and developpé.

Grand rond-de-jambe. Demi-fouetté.
Arabesques: allongées, penchées, voyagées.
Pointe work: échappé, temps de cou-de-pied,
posé, relevé.

Steps.

Temps-de-cuisse, gargouillades, fouetté-sauté, remainder of the pas de bourrée (15) all.

Petite Batterie.

Changements battus, entrechats 3 and 5 devant and derrière, jetés-battus, 20 brisés, coupé-brisé, brisé-telemaque, petits brisés en tournant, entrechat 5 ramassé (sissone fermée battue).
